Methodology: This national survey collected live interviews among 664 Republicans & Conservatives pulled from a listed sample of registered voters and was conducted February 15-18. These voters are defined in our sample as Registered Republicans, Republican primary voters or conservative leaning, independent voters. These are voters who met one of the following criteria: voted for Donald Trump in the election, currently approve of President Trump, support a Republican congressional candidate in the 2018 elections, or have partisan identification as a Republican or lean Republican. The subgroup of Trump Base Voters contains voters who met all the following criteria: voted for Donald Trump in the election, and current approval of President Trump, and current support for a Republican congressional candidate in the 2018 elections, and partisan identification as a Republican or lean Republican. Percentages might not equal 100% due to rounding.
