


Immigrants as Economic Drivers in Story and Boone Counties

Immigrant share of the population




In 2015, given their income, foreign-born residents contributed significantly to state and local taxes, including property, income, sales, and excise taxes levied by either the State of lowa or by municipal governments.

* Working age refers to people ages 16-64 years old.



378 local manufacturing jobs

Top industries by share of workforce




Share of U.S.-born
